Faith Formation for 7th & 8th Graders

Dear families,

Confirmation has been an important ministry of the church for many years. We continue to emphasize depth in teaching while still providing a highly relational, fun, and supportive environment for our young people to develop a lasting faith.

We are hope you'll join us on Sunday nights for Firmly Planted (our catechism program). Teaching for students and guides, small & large group interactions, worship, service, culminating in Faith Fold projects are each important components of the Firmly Planted program. We are a church that believes in reformation and we continue to mold this program with the following in mind:

- 1. Time is valuable. We live in a time when there are simply more demands on families' time and more choices for activities. While we recognize this, we also ask parents and families to prioritize faith during this formative time in the lives of children. We see each other only a couple of times each month throughout the school year. We want to maximize our time for faith development and relationship-building. Doing both during our time together will benefit students and their discipleship.
- 2. Parents are the primary influencers in the faith lives of their children. We value the connections made between parents and students around their faith and know that this is how faith is passed on. We have parent/adult-led small groups as a part of our catechism program. Parents will be invited to show their investment in the program through a variety of other ways, too (supporting programs, providing meals, etc.). When parents show that investing time and energy into faith formation matters, students see this priority.

Through stirring a deep faith in God, forming a stronger identity in Christ, and developing meaningful relationships within Christian community, our young people grow. At Prince of Peace, this is the path to Confirmation, a special time when students affirm their baptism.

SUNDAY NIGHT EVENTS

Year 1 – Worship & Sacraments, Lutheran Identity,
Discipleship, Difficult Faith Questions (2023-2024)
Year 2 – Biblical Background (2024-2025)

We will gather twice monthly (usually) from September to May. During this time we will have time for games, teaching, building relationships, small group mentoring, prayer experiences, and fun activities.

Small groups are a crucial part of the middle school experience and will help students form deeper relationships with new and old friends. We will meet from 6pm-8pm at Prince of Peace in the Parish Life Center. We understand that families' schedules are complex. Our request is that students participate in at least 80% of our gatherings (missing no more than 2 per year). We will provide make-up material for those who cannot attend, but sometimes we do things that simply cannot be replicated without being present. There are also retreats and social activities that supplement the program throughout the year.

This is a cornerstone of the Firmly Planted program because we want our young people to be deeply rooted in firm theology and we want to encourage families to grow in faith together. Students will be equipped through their participation. From these two years, we seek to help our students grow in breadth and depth of faith so they can stand firm in their beliefs for years to come.

FAITH FOLD PROJECT

As a culmination of the two-year Firmly Planted path to confirmation, students complete a Faith Fold Project. Confirmands share their faith in a visual and verbal presentation. This act of articulating their beliefs is a developmental stepping stone that strengthens faith. Students receive more information about this project the spring of their 8th grade year. They work on the project as they prepare for confirmation in the fall of their 9th grade year.

WORSHIP

One of the strongest indicators that young people will develop a lasting faith that joins them in Christian community in adulthood is when a family prioritizes worshiping together. It is this finding that has us emphasize worship as a priority for the Firmly Planted program.

- Students are expected to complete two worship summaries per month during the program year (September through May). Completing these worship summaries helps them make meaning out of what is happening in worship and how it connects with their day-to-day lives.
- Students learn by doing, so we ask that each participant find a way to serve in worship.
 Students can serve in any position in worship services. More information is included on a handout in this packet.

SERVICE

Another way we pass on faith to our young people is by giving them active ways to live & love like Jesus throughout our church and community through service projects. Each year, students are asked to find a way to serve in the community for at least 8 hours. Middle School students are invited to many POP Service Projects and these will be highlighted in email communication.

- helping with LIFE Food Pantry events
- God's Work. Our Hands. weekend
- service projects with Girl/Boy Scouts
- Matthew 25 Ministries


Youth Team Parent Roles with Firmly Planted

We organize all our volunteer roles at Prince of Peace by teams. The Youth Team serves the 7th – 12th grade students of Prince of Peace. Youth Team members are connectors for youth and the church and faith experience. They are spiritual mentors. They are adults who are authentic, affirming and available.

We need at least 6 Firmly Planted Guides (men and women) who will:

- Build relationships with our young people in Firmly Planted and their families.
- Attend Sunday Night Events and serve as an adult leader for 5-7 youth.
- Facilitate small group time (leading highs and lows, lead activities with material & discussion questions provided).
- Participate as an adult leader in the program.
- Check in with these teenagers throughout their middle-school years.
